ARRIVAL CHECKLIST

(FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS ON CAMPUS OF ZWICKAU)

How to prepare for your stay

- Check entry requirements and apply for a visa if needed (Please try to clarify visa matters **at least** 2 months in advance.)
- Proof of financial resources for your stay (€934 per month)!!!
- Book flight/train tickets
- Reserve a room in the student dorm/accommodation **well in advance!**

Please inform your Tutor of your arrival time!

- You can arrive on weekdays between 09.00 and 19.00 one week before the courses start.
- Inform your tutor whether you will take part in the German Intensive Course in September
- We have estimated the approximate expenses for the first few days in Zwickau to around €530/€470. This does **not** include expenses for basic necessities such as food, study materials etc.
- Make sure that you have enough **cash** (euros), as **the first days are very expensive** (rent & deposit, tuition fees, health insurance etc.)
- Ensure you have all the relevant documents ready
- Establish contact to the WHZ Tutors to inform them about your travel plans and arrival time

1-2 weeks

Make sure that you bring along

- Any specific medication you need
- Emergency contact addresses, phone numbers
- Plug adaptors
- Passport/ ID card and passport photos
- International driving licence (optional)

Contact your Tutor at the university.

- inform them about your arrival time and provide them with a telephone number for contact whilst travelling
- inform them whether you need the bed linen/duvet/pillow for the dorm/student accommodation
- If you wish that your tutor picks up your dorm-room key before your arrival in Zwickau, then your tutor requires a power of attorney and a copy of your rental contract.





After you arrived in Zwickau

Costs:

- deposit (**€380**)
- rent (between **€187** and **€270**)

3. Matriculation to study

(Student Secretariat, Dezernat Studienangelegenheiten, RI221, cf. map)

- the semester fee currently amounts to around **275€** for studying in Zwickau and about **100€** for studying in Markneukirchen, Schneeberg, or Reichenbach
- pay for the German Intensive Course at cash office PKB 136 (if you have signed up for it)
- At the Student Secretariat PKB 221 (see map) you will need to show:
 - copy of your visa
 - proof of payment for the semester (receipt)
 - copy of your health insurance confirmation for the whole study-period

You will receive the following documents after enrolment:

- Student ID card
- Statement of enrolment (Immatrikulationsbescheinigung)
- Application form for network services (ZKI, Nutzerdienste)

4. Register with ZKI (Network Services)

- there is another application form which **has to be filled out by the administration of the student accommodation** which you can complete when signing your rental contract

- Bring your **passport and the completed form „Wohnungsgeberbestätigung (WGB)“**
- You can download the form on the website
- Ask your tutor for help with the registration.

7. Open a bank account in Germany

- Some offer a youth-bank-account, which is free of charge
- Ask your tutor for help

The following requirements only apply to **non-EU citizens**

8. Register at the Registration Office for Foreigners

Register with the Foreigners' Registration Office (Ausländermeldebehörde)
When you are from a non-EU country with a visa shorter than your time in Germany, you need to apply for residence permit.

The following documents are required (original & copy):

- Completed application form with a biometric passport photo
- Copy of the valid visa
- Copy of your health insurance certificate
- Copy of your rental contract
- Statement of enrollment
- Proof of financial support in Germany (€934 per month, e.g. blocked bank account)
- Administrative fee €100

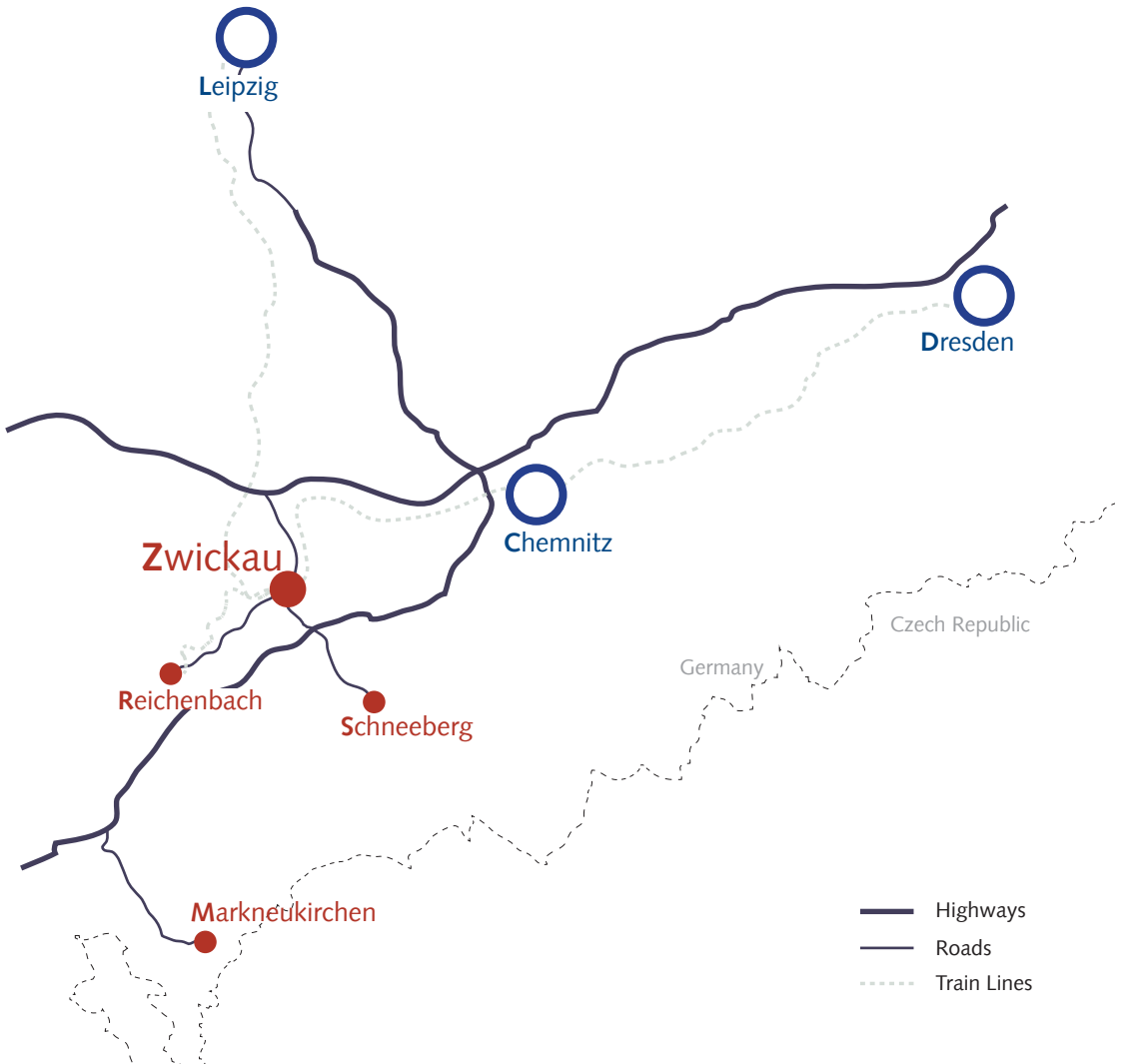

Our Campuses

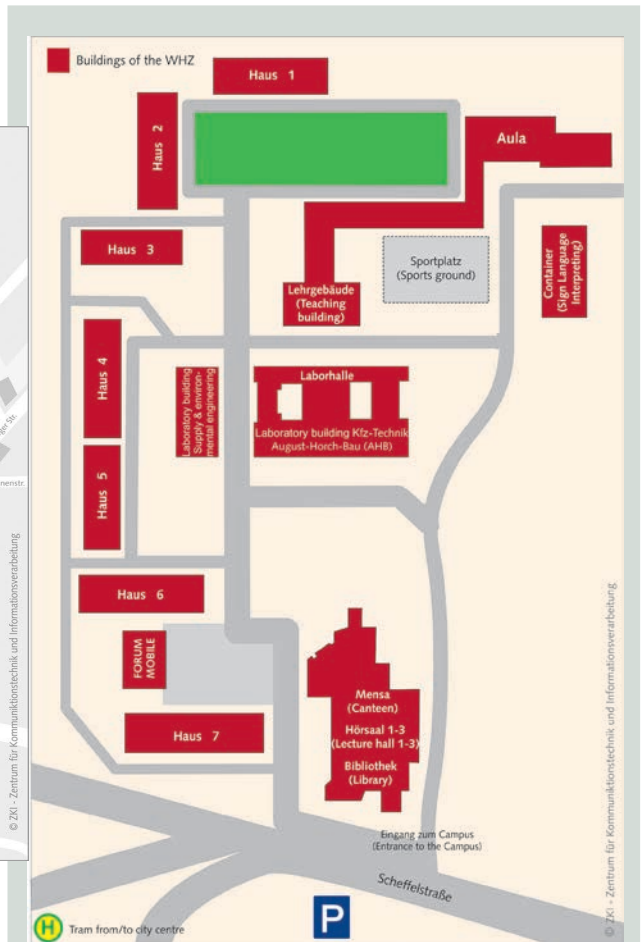

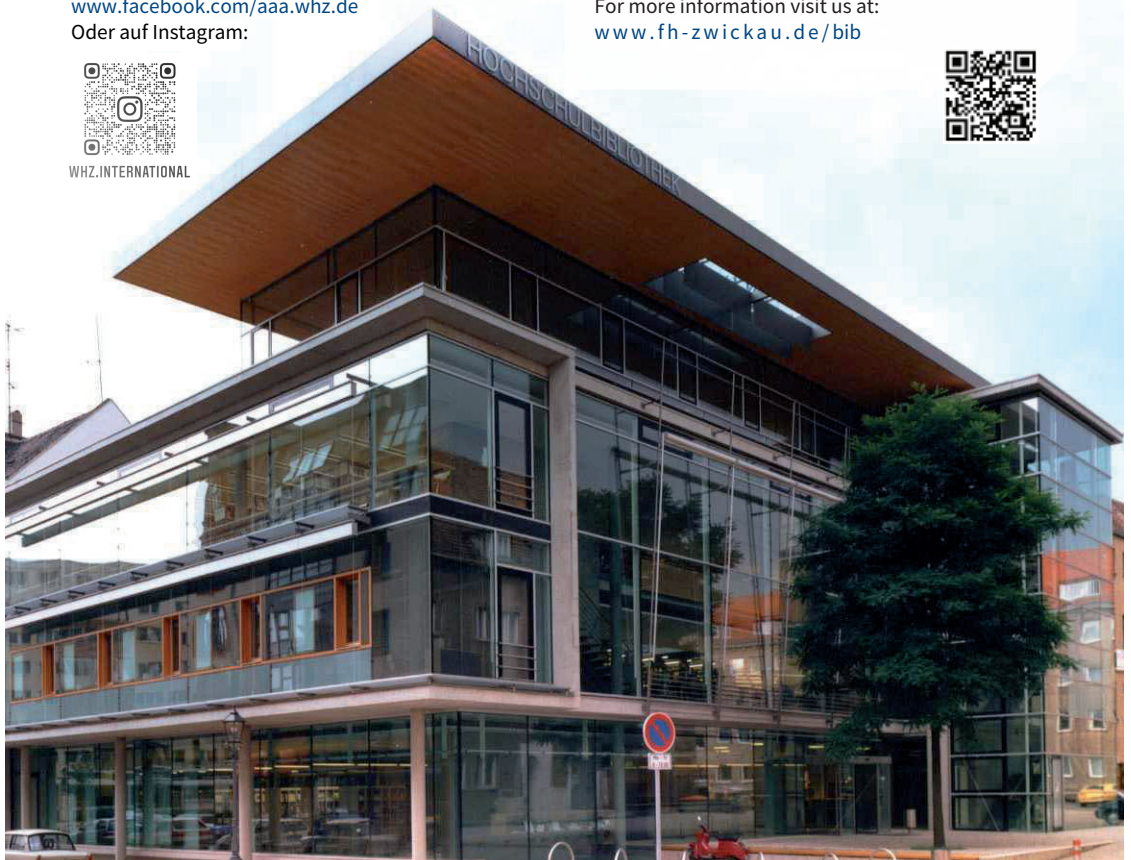

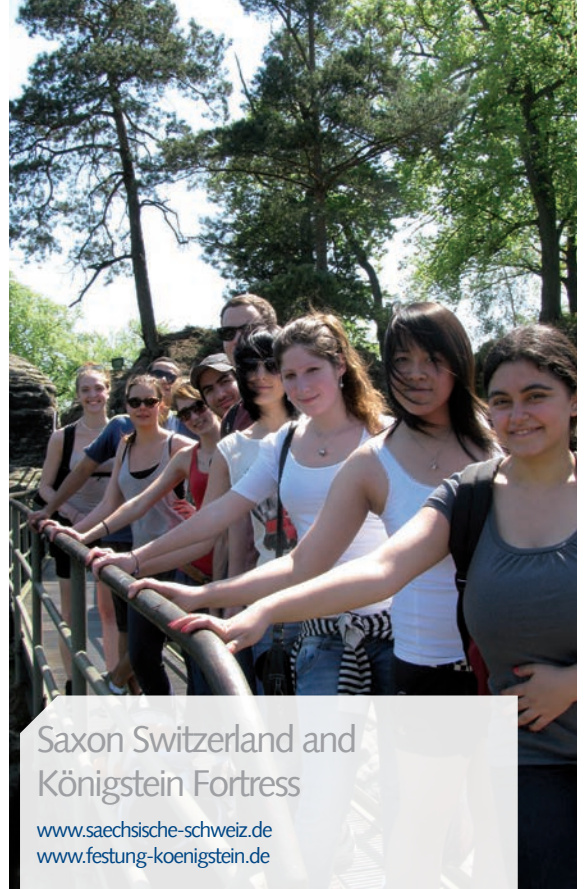

DEPARTURE CHECKLIST

(FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS ON CAMPUS OF ZWICKAU)

1. Give notice of departure

1 week
in advance

- Fill out the form „Antrag auf Exmatrikulation“ (application for exmatriculation)
- Submit your form to the Dezernat Studienangelegenheiten (Student Secretariat)
- Deactivate Student Card in the Mensa and request remaining money (paid in cash)
- Return all borrowed books to the library

2. Cancel your Health Insurance in Germany

(Important for Non-EU-citizens)

1 week
in advance

- Cancel your German health insurance.
- Make sure that there is no unpaid balance.

3. Contact the International Office

1 week
in advance

- The office needs to sign the Departure Confirmation form for your home institution (if needed)
- Apply for the Transcript of Records (state your domestic address so that the document can be sent to this address)

4. Cancel registration with the Residents' Registration Office

(Meldebehörde, Rathaus)

5 - 7 days
in advance

The required documents are:

- proof of identification (passport)

5. Contact the Student Residence Office to cancel rental contract

6 days
in advance

- Fill out the checklist „Laufzettel für den Auszug“
- Make sure you have contacted all required offices before departing

6. Contact facility management to return your room key

- Fill out the checklist „Laufzettel für den Auszug“ for facility management
- Return the keys

4 - 5 days
in advance

7. Close your bank account in Germany

2 - 1 days
in advance

8. Student exchange markets in dormitory Zwickau

Student exchange markets can be used to leave items you cannot take home and which you do not longer need (e.g. bed linen, books) to offer them to other students.
